The Challenge:

Patient navigation is a proven approach to improving cancer care access, equity, and outcomes, but its implementation varies widely across countries and contexts.

- There is no global standard to guide effective, equitable, and sustainable PN models.
- Existing efforts are often siloed, underresourced, and unaligned.
- Many regions lack formalized PN systems or trained navigators.
- Cancer patients, especially in low-resource settings, face avoidable barriers throughout their care journey.
